1	Greater White-fronted Goose	<i>Anser albifrons</i>	Seen in St. Paul and Nome with best views in Barrow of a pair close to the road.
2	Emperor Goose	<i>Chen canagica</i>	A pair seen from Council Road and then again flying near the train to nowhere.
3	Snow Goose	<i>Chen caerulescens</i>	Three seen flying over on the way out to Point Barrow
4	Black Brant (Pacific)	<i>Branta bernicla nigricans</i>	Single birds seen in the Pribilofs and on Council Road in Nome.
5	Canada Goose	<i>Branta canadensis</i>	Seen from Nome River Bridge on Council Road and in Potter's Marsh in Anchorage
	Aleutian Cackling Goose	<i>Branta c. leucopareia</i>	A flock of 20 seen at the north end of St. Paul Island on two days.
	Lesser Canada Goose	<i>Branta c. parvipes</i>	Seen at Westchester Lagoon in Anchorage and on the way to and from Seward
	Dusky Canada Goose	<i>Branta c. occidentalis</i>	Seen in Nome on Teller Road
6	Trumpeter Swan	<i>Cygnus buccinator</i>	Several pairs nesting on Denali Highway and also seen in Barrow.
7	Tundra Swan	<i>Cygnus columbianus</i>	Seen along the roads in Nome, on Denali Highway and in Barrow
8	American Wigeon	<i>Anas americana</i>	Seen commonly throughout the main tour
9	Mallard	<i>Anas platyrhynchos</i>	Seen commonly throughout the main tour and also in Barrow and Dutch Harbor
10	Northern Shoveler	<i>Anas clypeata</i>	Seen commonly throughout the main tour and also in Barrow.
11	Northern Pintail	<i>Anas acuta</i>	Seen commonly throughout the main tour and also in Barrow.
12	Green-winged Teal	<i>Anas carolinensis</i>	Seen in the Pribilofs, Nome, Barrow, Denali Highway and Dutch Harbor
13	Eurasian Teal	<i>Anas crecca</i>	Seen in St. Paul on a small pool and at Northeast Point in good evening light and in Dutch Harbor.
14	Canvasback	<i>Aythya valisineria</i>	Female seen at Potter's Marsh.
15	Ring-necked Duck	<i>Aythya collaris</i>	Seen in Hood Lake by the hotel in Anchorage
16	Greater Scaup	<i>Aythya marila</i>	Seen commonly during the main tour.
17	Lesser Scaup	<i>Aythya affinis</i>	Seen mostly in the Denali area and along Denali Highway.
18	Steller's Eider	<i>Polysticta stelleri</i>	One bird seen flying along the beach at Council Road in Nome. Seen well in Barrow. The most common eider seen there with upwards of 20 seen in one day.
19	King Eider	<i>Somateria spectabilis</i>	One female seen in the Pribilofs and several handsome looking males seen in Barrow including three feeding in some pools in the ice off the beach.
20	Common Eider	<i>Somateria mollissima</i>	Seen offshore from Council Road in Nome and from Kougarak Road.
21	Harlequin Duck	<i>Histrionicus histrionicus</i>	Common in the Pribilofs, Nome, and Seward and at least 300 seen in one day in Dutch Harbor.
22	Surf Scoter	<i>Melanitta perspicillata</i>	A small flock seen flying in Aialik Bay.
23	White-winged	<i>Melanitta deglandi</i>	A pair seen in a lake along Denali Highway and in the sea at

	Scoter		Dutch Harbor.
24	Black Scoter	<i>Melanitta americana</i>	A flock was scoped from the front of our hotel in Nome and a great view of a single close adult in an inlet along Council Road.
25	Long-tailed Duck	<i>Clangula hyemalis</i>	Seen commonly in the Pribilofs and Nome with some nice male and females around nests. Also seen along Denali Highway and in Barrow.
26	Bufflehead	<i>Bucephala albeola</i>	Seen in a few locations along Denali Highway and very briefly in the Pribilofs.
27	Common Goldeneye	<i>Bucephala clangula</i>	Seen along the drive from Anchorage to Seward.
28	Barrow's Goldeneye	<i>Bucephala islandica</i>	A group seen in a fenced pond in Seward and along Denali Highway.
29	Common Merganser	<i>Mergus merganser</i>	At least 25 birds seen in a river north of Paxson.
30	Red-breasted Merganser	<i>Mergus serrator</i>	Seen mostly in Nome and Dutch Harbor. Pairs and family groups in evidence at Dutch Harbor.
31	Willow Ptarmigan	<i>Lagopus lagopus</i>	Seen very well from the roads in Nome and from interior roads in Dutch Harbor.
32	Rock Ptarmigan	<i>Lagopus mutus</i>	One very white bird seen well along Teller Road and one seen in Denali National Park.
33	Red-throated Loon	<i>Gavia stellata</i>	Pairs of these gorgeous birds seen in ponds in Nome and Barrow.
34	Pacific Loon	<i>Gavia pacifica</i>	One bird seen well on a nest at the end of Council Road in Nome and others seen in Barrow.
35	Common Loon	<i>Gavia immer</i>	Seen on Denali Highway and also in the harbor at Dutch Harbor.
36	Yellow-billed Loon	<i>Gavia adamsii</i>	One flyover bird seen well on the way back from Point Barrow.
37	Horned Grebe	<i>Podiceps auritus</i>	Seen very well in a ditch across from Potter's Marsh and along Denali Highway.
38	Red-necked Grebe	<i>Podiceps grisegena</i>	Seen well at Westchester Lagoon and in Potter's Marsh. Also seen in Dutch Harbor.
39	Northern Fulmar	<i>Fulmarus glacialis</i>	Several birds nesting and flying below us as we overlooked the see in the Pribilofs. Also seen on the Dutch Harbor pelagic.
40	Short-tailed Shearwater	<i>Puffinus tenuirostris</i>	Many seen during the Dutch Harbor pelagic. Three distant birds flying over the see off St. Paul.
41	Fork-tailed Storm-Petrel	<i>Oceanodroma furcata</i>	Seen flying along the boat on Kenai Fjords allowing great flight views.
42	Leach's Storm-Petrel	<i>Oceanodroma leucorhoa</i>	Seen flying in Alalik Bay during Kenai Fjords boat trip.
43	Red-faced Cormorant	<i>Phalacrocorax urile</i>	Seen well perched on rocks just offshore at St. Paul and during the boat trip on Kenai Fjords
44	Pelagic Cormorant	<i>Phalacrocorax pelagicus</i>	Seen in Nome and very well in Dutch Harbor.
45	Osprey	<i>Pandion haliaetus</i>	One bird seen flying over the road on the way to Denali National Park.
46	Bald Eagle	<i>Haliaetus leucocephalus</i>	Common beginning with the drive along Cook Inlet and high numbers in Dutch Harbor.
47	Northern Harrier	<i>Circus cyaneus</i>	Seen along Kougarok Road in Nome and in Denali National Park.
48	Northern Goshawk	<i>Accipiter gentilis</i>	One bird seen chased by a Northern Shrike across Denali Highway.
49	Red-tailed Hawk	<i>Buteo jamaicensis</i>	Many very dark (Harlan's) birds seen along the highway on the drive to Seward and back to Anchorage from Denali.
50	Rough-legged Hawk	<i>Buteo lagopus</i>	Seen in Nome perched on a rock along Kougarok Road and along Teller Road and on the way back from Denali Highway to Anchorage.
51	Golden Eagle	<i>Aquila chrysaetos</i>	Seen in Nome and Denali National Park where five birds

			soared above the hilltops on a thermal. Also seen along Denali Highway.
52	Merlin	<i>Falco columbarius</i>	Best views were of a family group in a spruce along the road in Denali National Park.
53	Gyrfalcon	<i>Falco rusticolus</i>	One bird seen on a nest on a rocky ledge from Kougarak Road. Another flew low over us as we walked the trail at Eagle River and one seen on a cliff from the road to the hanging bridge above Paxson.
54	Peregrine Falcon	<i>Falco peregrinus</i>	Seen well in Barrow flying over the tundra.
55	Sandhill Crane	<i>Grus canadensis</i>	Four flew high over us at the Nome River Bridge and more were seen along Council Road.
56	Black-bellied Plover	<i>Pluvialis squatarola</i>	Best views were of a gorgeous bird in breeding plumage was seen off of Teller Road possibly guarding a nest from jaegers.
57	American Golden Plover	<i>Pluvialis dominic</i>	Seen at the Smith's Longspur site on Denali Highway but best views were in Barrow near a radar installation.
58	Pacific Golden Plover	<i>Pluvialis fulva</i>	Best views of a bright adult at the Sinuk River Bridge on Teller Road in Nome. Also seen dive-bombing a Parasitic Jaeger on another road off Teller.
59	Semipalmated Plover	<i>Charadrius semipalmatus</i>	The most birds seen in the Pribilofs with ten seen in one day often in the road.
60	Black Oystercatcher	<i>Haematopus bachmani</i>	First seen during the Kenai Fjords trip on some rocks near shore and then again in Dutch Harbor.
61	Spotted Sandpiper	<i>Actitis macularia</i>	For some reason we had difficulty finding this bird until the last day of the main tour when we had one on an island in a small lake behind a restaurant where we made a pit stop.
62	Wandering Tattler	<i>Heteroscelus incanus</i>	Seen well near Southwest Point on St. Paul and also seen on Kougarak Road in Nome.
63	Greater Yellowlegs	<i>Tringa melanoleuca</i>	One bird seen along Council Road in Nome.
64	Lesser Yellowlegs	<i>Tringa flavipes</i>	Seen perched high on a dead tree in the Potter's Marsh near Anchorage and then again on some tree tops along Denali Highway.
65	Hudsonian Whimbrel	<i>Numenius hudsonicus</i>	First seen flying over the northeast point in St. Paul and then also at the Bristle-thighed Curlew sight in Nome. Several seen along Denali Highway.
66	Bristle-thighed Curlew	<i>Numenius tahitiensis</i>	Great views off Kougarak Road in Nome first flying and then walking along the tundra. Some views allowed us to see the bristles on the legs!
67	Hudsonian Godwit	<i>Limosa haemastica</i>	A group of five seen on the first day in the Pribilofs.
68	Bar-tailed Godwit	<i>Limosa lapponica</i>	First seen in a small flock on a mudflat in St. Paul. Also seen from the Nome River Bridge and then the Sinuk River Bridge along Teller Road in Nome and then a small flock seen along Council Road.
69	Ruddy Turnstone	<i>Arenaria interpres</i>	A striking adult in breeding plumage was seen during our lunch stop off Teller Road. Also seen along Council Road in Nome.
70	Surfbird	<i>Aphriza virgata</i>	Four seen on the ground near a half frozen lake off Kougarak Road in Nome.
71	Semipalmated Sandpiper	<i>Calidris pusilla</i>	Best views were in Nome where an adult bird was tending to a nest not far from where we were standing on the tundra. Also seen in Barrow.
72	Western Sandpiper	<i>Calidris mauri</i>	Seen very well in bright, breeding plumage at the Nome River bridge.
73	Red-necked Stint	<i>Calidris ruficollis</i>	A few birds from Council Road in Nome.
74	Least Sandpiper	<i>Calidris minutilla</i>	One bird seen near a pond at the north end of Nome.

75	Baird's Sandpiper	<i>Calidris bairdii</i>	Seen across a small pond
76	Pectoral Sandpiper	<i>Calidris melanoto</i>	Seen very well at the north end of St. Paul and displaying in Barrow
77	Rock Sandpiper (Pribilofs)	<i>Calidris ptilocnemis ptilocnemis</i>	Several birds seen doing their wing stretch display on St. Paul.
78	Dunlin	<i>Calidris alpina</i>	A flock of six seen along Council Road in Nome and a long bird seen in Barrow in the shorebird pools at the end of the road near the snow bank.
79	Stilt Sandpiper	<i>Calidris himantipus</i>	One bird seen off Council Road in Nome.
80	Short-billed Dowitcher	<i>Limnodromus griseus</i>	Seen well in rain pool close to the road in St. Paul
81	Long-billed Dowitcher	<i>Limnodromus scolopaceus</i>	Seen very well from the road on all three days in Barrow.
82	Wilson's Snipe	<i>Gallinago delicata</i>	Heard more often than seen in the Pribilofs, Nome, Denali Highway and Dutch Harbor. Winnowing calls were the background noise in many areas except Barrow.
83	Red-necked Phalarope	<i>Phalaropus lobatus</i>	Very common in ponds along Denali Highway and in Barrow.
84	Red Phalarope (Gray)	<i>Phalaropus fulicarius</i>	Five birds seen of the beach from Council Road in Nome and very common in Barrow.
85	Bonaparte's Gull	<i>Larus philadelphia</i>	Seen in Anchorage across a mud flat near Westchester Lagoon. Also in Nome and along Denali Highway.
86	Mew Gull	<i>Larus brachyrhynchus</i>	Seen almost daily except in Dutch Harbor.
87	American Herring Gull	<i>Larus smithsonianus</i>	Seen in the Pribilofs and a group of 10 seen on the last night off Paxson Road over a river.
88	Slaty-backed Gull	<i>Larus schistisagus</i>	Seen first in the Pribilofs and then from the Safety Sound bridge on Council Road in Nome.
89	Glaucous-winged Gull	<i>Larus glaucescens</i>	First seen well in Anchorage near Westchester Lagoon and then several seen at the dump in Nome. Also seen on the Kenai Fjords trip.
90	Glaucous Gull	<i>Larus hyperboreus</i>	Fairly common in the Pribilofs and Nome and seen again in Barrow.
91	Sabine's Gull	<i>Xema sabini</i>	First seen flying over Council Road and then again very well in the same area. Also seen along the beach in Barrow.
92	Black-legged Kittiwake	<i>Rissa tridactyla</i>	Very common on the nesting cliffs at St. Paul and during the Kenai Fjords trip and in Dutch Harbor during our pelagic trip.
93	Red-legged Kittiwake	<i>Rissa brevirostris</i>	Seen very well on the nesting cliffs in St. Paul as well as flying.
94	Aleutian Tern	<i>Sterna aleutica</i>	A few birds flew low over us at the Nome River bridge and more feeding just off shore from Council Road in Nome.
95	Arctic Tern	<i>Sterna paradisaea</i>	Fairly common in Nome and along the Denali Highway and in Barrow.
96	Pomarine Jaeger	<i>Stercorarius pomarinus</i>	Seen first in St. Paul way offshore and then closer in Nome. The best views by far were in Barrow where these birds were quite common.
97	Parasitic Jaeger	<i>Stercorarius parasiticus</i>	Our first good flight views were over Big Lake in St. Paul and then seen well in Nome and Barrow.
98	Long-tailed Jaeger	<i>Stercorarius longicaudus</i>	The first of many views was a flying bird right over our heads at the Nome River Bridge. This species was very common in Nome and we had many excellent views there as well as along Denali Highway.
99	Common Murre	<i>Uria aalge</i>	Many seen clinging to the cliffs in St. Paul and in the waters of Safety Sound in Nome. Also seen in Dutch Harbor.
100	Thick-billed Murre	<i>Uria lomvia</i>	Several groups of Thick-billed Murres flew by while we were overlooking the sea on our first day in St. Paul. Also seen on the nesting cliffs there.
101	Pigeon	<i>Cephus columba</i>	Seen at coastal areas throughout the tour and very well from

	Guillemot		the road at Dutch Harbor.
102	Marbled Murrelet	<i>Brachyramphus marmoratus</i>	Several seen off Seward in the Kenai Fjords and seen well for comparison with Kittlitz's during the boat trip in the fjords.
103	Kittlitz's Murrelet	<i>Brachyramphus brevirostris</i>	Several seen very well in the waters off Aialik Glacier.
104	Ancient Murrelet	<i>Synthliboramphus antiquus</i>	Seen first in the harbor at St. Paul and then in the waters off the seabird cliffs. More birds seen during the Dutch Harbor pelagic.
105	Parakeet Auklet	<i>Aethia psittacula</i>	Seen very well on the cliffs at St. Paul.
106	Least Auklet	<i>Aethia pusilla</i>	Seen very well from the road at St. Paul and then on the nesting cliffs.
107	Crested Auklet	<i>Aethia cristata</i>	Seen very well on the seabird cliffs at St. Paul.
108	Rhinoceros Auklet	<i>Cerorhinca monocerata</i>	Seen well on the Kenai Fjords cruise.
109	Horned Puffin	<i>Fratercula corniculata</i>	Seen on the nesting cliffs and flying in Nome. Also seen during the Kenai trip and in Dutch Harbor.
110	Tufted Puffin	<i>Lunda cirrhata</i>	Fairly common in most coastal areas and seen well on the St. Paul nesting cliffs.
111	Rock Dove	<i>Columba livia</i>	Seen around town in Anchorage and Dutch Harbor.
112	Great Horned Owl	<i>Bubo virginianus</i>	Three nests each with two half grown chicks found during the tour – one at Eagle River, one in Denali National Park and one off Paxson Road.
113	Northern Hawk-Owl	<i>Surnia ulula</i>	Two or three birds seen. The first attacking a Great Horned Owl off Paxson Road and then again perched on top of a spruce along the main road. Another seen perched on a power line as we made our way back to Anchorage.
114	Short-eared Owl	<i>Asio flammeus</i>	Seen coursing over open tundra in St. Paul and then perched on the ground.
115	Rufous Hummingbird	<i>Selasphorus rufus</i>	Several birds seen at feeders in Seward and then a bright male seen incredibly well perched atop a small spruce at the side of the road.
116	Belted Kingfisher	<i>Ceryle alcyon</i>	A flyover seen at Eagle River and another male seen well above a small river in Dutch Harbor.
117	Hairy Woodpecker	<i>Picoides villosus</i>	One bird seen very well at Eagle River as it perched on a fallen tree near the trail.
118	American Three-toed Woodpecker	<i>Picoides dorsalis</i>	Fantastic views of a male and female feeding young at a nest hole in Eagle River.
119	Northern Flicker		Seen flying over the road while heading back to Anchorage at the end of the tour. The bird perched briefly and then was off.
120	Olive-sided Flycatcher	<i>Contopus cooperi</i>	Seen well and hear often in the forested areas along Denali Highway and Paxson Road.
121	Alder Flycatcher	<i>Empidonax alnorum</i>	A few birds seen very well singing and perched atop spruces at Eagle River.
122	Say's Phoebe	<i>Sayornis saya</i>	Seen from a bridge overlooking a river on Teller Road and then again at our stop for the Bluethroats on Kougarok Road.
123	Northern Shrike	<i>Lanius excubitor</i>	First seen perched on top of a small tree on Kougarok Road and then chasing a Northern Goshawk over Denali Highway.
124	Gray Jay	<i>Perisoreus canadensis</i>	A pair seen flying above the sled dog demonstration at Denali.
125	Steller's Jay	<i>Cyanocitta stelleri</i>	A pair of birds eluded is in the town of Seward but then one was very confiding on the road along the shoreline.
126	Black-billed Magpie	<i>Pica hudsonia</i>	Commonly seen during the main tour in Anchorage, Denali, and Seward.
127	Northwestern Crow	<i>Corvus caurinus</i>	Seen in a campground near a marina in Seward.
128	Common Raven	<i>Corvus corax</i>	Very common in Anchorage, Denali, Seward, and Nome.

129	Horned Lark	<i>Eremophila alpestris</i>	One bird seen – a <i>hoytii</i> - arctic race seen close to the road on Kougarak Road
130	Tree Swallow	<i>Tachycineta bicolor</i>	First seen flying around Westchester Lagoon in Anchorage, then Potter's Marsh, and also driving back from Denali Highway.
131	Violet-green Swallow	<i>Tachycineta thalassina</i>	Very common during the main tour near any freshwater.
132	Bank Swallow	<i>Riparia riparia</i>	Fairly common on the main tour and in Dutch Harbor.
133	Cliff Swallow	<i>Hirundo pyrrhonota</i>	Best views were of several birds gathering mud at a puddle on Denali Highway.
134	Black-capped Chickadee	<i>Poecile atricapillus</i>	Seen near Westchester Lagoon and around the hotel in Anchorage.
135	Chestnut-backed Chickadee	<i>Poecile rufescens</i>	Two of these delightful birds were seen incredibly well in Seward in a natural area near the shore.
136	Boreal Chickadee	<i>Poecile hudsonicus</i>	Seen well at eye level on the boardwalk at Eagle River Nature Center. Also seen on Denali Highway.
137	Brown Creeper		Two birds seen tending a nest under a piece of bark on a dead spruce on the trail at Eagle River.
138	Winter Wren	<i>Troglodytes troglodytes</i>	One bird seen very well near the quarry in St. Paul.
139	American Dipper	<i>Cinclus mexicanus</i>	Two birds seen in Nome going back and forth through a culvert under the road with nesting material. Also a pair bringing food into a nest under bridge in Dutch Harbor.
140	Ruby-crowned Kinglet	<i>Regulus calendula</i>	Seen very well near the road on Denali Highway with one bird showing its bright red crest.
141	Arctic Warbler	<i>Phylloscopus borealis</i>	A singing adult seen very well on Denali Highway.
142	Bluethroat	<i>Luscinia svecica</i>	Three males displaying and chasing each other off Kougarak Road in Nome.
143	Northern Wheatear	<i>Oenanthe oenanthe</i>	One bird seen flying around near a monolith off Kougarak Road in Nome. Others seen in Denali National Park.
144	Gray-cheeked Thrush	<i>Catharus minimus</i>	Very common in Nome and also seen along Denali Highway.
145	Hermit Thrush	<i>Catharus guttatus</i>	Four seen along Denali Highway including excellent views of a bird singing from a spruce top.
146	American Robin	<i>Turdus migratorius</i>	Common in Nome, Seward, and Denali.
147	Varied Thrush	<i>Ixoreus naevius</i>	Best views were at our lunch stop along Kougarak Road in Nome. Also seen at Eagle River
148	Eastern Yellow Wagtail	<i>Motacilla flava tschutschensis</i>	One seen at the north end of St. Paul and several seen along the roads in Nome.
149	American Pipit	<i>Anthus rubescens pacificus</i>	One bird that Steve found in Nome was ignored due to the Bluethroat activity. Another was seen well on the grass near the permit office in Dutch Harbor.
150	Bohemian Waxwing	<i>Bombycilla garrulus</i>	Seen well along Denali Highway
151	Orange-crowned Warbler	<i>Vermivora celata</i>	Several seen very well in Nome.
152	Yellow Warbler	<i>Dendroica petechia</i>	Common in Nome and along Denali Highway.
153	Yellow-rumped Warbler	<i>Dendroica coronata coronata</i>	Seen well along the road in Nome. Also seen in Seward and Denali National Park.
154	Townsend's Warbler	<i>Dendroica townsendi</i>	Fantastically close views in a local park in Seward. It doesn't get any better.
155	Blackpoll Warbler	<i>Dendroica striata</i>	First seen along Kougarak Road in Nome and then very well along Denali Highway.
156	Northern Waterthrush	<i>Seiurus noveboracensis</i>	Best views ever from the Snake River bridge along Teller Road in Nome.

157	Wilson's Warbler	<i>Wilsonia pusilla</i>	Very common in Nome and along Denali Highway
158	American Tree Sparrow	<i>Spizella arborea</i>	Seen in Nome and along Denali Highway
159	Savannah Sparrow	<i>Passerculus sandwichensis</i>	Seen in Nome and on Denali Highway as well as Dutch Harbor
160	Red Fox Sparrow	<i>Passerella iliaca</i>	Seen well along the road in Nome and on Denali Highway near the Smith's Longspur site.
161	Song Sparrow	<i>Melospiza melodia</i>	Seen from the boat on shore during the Kenai Fjords cruise
162	White-crowned Sparrow	<i>Zonotrichia leucophrys</i>	Common in Nome. Also seen well on Denali Highway.
163	Golden-crowned Sparrow	<i>Zonotrichia atricapilla</i>	Several seen well along the roads in Nome
164	Dark-eyed Junco	<i>Junco hyemalis</i>	Seen mostly in Denali National Park and on Denali Highway. One seen on the last day in Dutch Harbor.
165	Lapland Longspur	<i>Calcarius lapponicus</i>	Very common in St. Paul with many males singing and displaying. Also seen in Nome, Barrow, and Dutch Harbor.
166	Smith's Longspur	<i>Calcarius pictus</i>	One bird seen flying over the tundra along Denali Highway and then seen very well as it landed on the ground in the open for several minutes allowing scope views and photographs.
167	Snow Bunting	<i>Plectrophenax nivalis</i>	Seen first in the Pribilofs and then in Nome, Barrow and Dutch Harbor.
168	Red-winged Blackbird	<i>Agelaius phoeniceus</i>	A few birds seen at Potter's Marsh in Anchorage.
