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Panama Canopy Camp SPECIES LIST September 4 - 9, 2016

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ITINERARY

Day 1: Pan-American Highway, Nusegandi, Tortí (lunch stop), Canopy Camp.

Day 2: Canopy Camp, Yaviza Road

Day 3: Chucunaque River; Tuquesa River, Nuevo Vigia, El Salto Rd

Day 4: Chucunaque and Membrillo Rivers, Sinai Community

Day 5: Canopy Camp, Meteti (fields), San Francisco Reserve, Tortí (lunch stop), Panama City

NOTE: Nomenclature for the most part conform with the 7th Edition of the AOU checklist of North American Birds published in 1998 (and subsequent updates).

BIRDS:

- 1. Little Tinamou (Crypturellus soui) Every day part of morning chorus.
- 2. Black-bellied Whistling-Duck (Dendrocygna autumnalis) Seen on all days.
- 3. Muscovy Duck (Cairina moschata) Real ones flying over the Chucunaque on two days.
- 4. Gray-headed Chachalaca (Ortalis cinereiceps) One brief view on the Chucunaque.
- 5. Marbled Wood Quail (Odontophorus gujanensis) Heard near the Harpy Eagle.
- 6. Wood Stork (Mycteria Americana) Soaring over the river on day three
- 7. Green Ibis (Mesembrinibis cayennensis) Brief river views.
- 8. Striated Heron (Butorides striata) On the Chucanaque.
- 9. Cattle Egret (Bubulcus ibis) Seen in large numbers mainly as flyovers.
- 10. Cocoi Heron (Ardea cocoi) Seen on 2 days. Best views in Meteti field roadside.
- 11. Great Egret (Ardea alba) Seen on 4 days often from the road while traveling.
- 12. Capped Heron (Pilherodius pileatus) Two brief river riews.
- 13. Tricolored Heron brief views as one flushed from river bank on day three.
- 14. Little Blue Heron (Egretta caerulea) Adults common along the river.
- 15. Snowy Egret (Egretta Thula) Mainly river flyovers)
- 16. Neotropic Cormorant (Phalacrocorax brasilianus) Seen on 3 days perched along river.
- 17. Anhinga (Anhinga anhinga) Seen on the Chucunaque River and as soaring flyovers.
- 18. Turkey Vulture (Cathartes aura) Seen daily.
- 19. Black Vulture (Coragyps atratus) Abundant.
- 20. King Vulture (Sarcoramphus Papa) Adult and Juvenile flyovers at Canopy Camp on two days.
- 21. Osprey (Pandion Haliaetus) Flyover
- 22. Gray-headed Kite (Leptodon cayanensis) Nice scope views at El Salto Rd.
- 23. Swallow-tailed Kite (Elanoides forficatu) Seen 4 days as flyovers. Migrants regularly overhead including kettles of over 30 birds.
- 24. Harpy Eagle (Harpia Harpyja) One bird on a nest. First group to see this bird and visit the village of the local tribal community who discovered it!!!!
- 25. Black Hawk-Eagle (Spizaetus tyrannus) heard only at Harpy spot.
- 26. White-tailed Kite (Elanus leucurus) Brief road views on the last day.
- 27. Double-toothed Kite (Harpagus bidentatus) First scoped bird of the trip seen well on 3 days.
- 28. Bicolored Hawk (Accipiter bicolor) Amazingly cooperative juvenile bird at San Francisco
- 29. Plumbeous Kite (Ictinia plumbea) Birds on were seen on 4 days in migration.
- 30. Crane Hawk (Geranospiza caerulescens) Seen on two days, best scoped views at Harpy spot.
- 31. Common Black Hawk (Buteogallus anthracinus) Canopy Camp flyover and perched in field

edge at Meteti.

- 32. Savanna Hawk (Buteogallus meridionalis) Flyover at Canopy Camp.
- 33. Roadside Hawk (Buteo magnirostris) Seen well at Canopy Camp.
- 34. Gray-lined Hawk (Buteo nitidus) Common on boat ride on day four.
- 35. Short-tailed Hawk (Buteo brachyurus) Within was of birds over Canopy Camp on day two (light morphs)
- 36. Zone-tailed Hawk (Buteo Albonotatus) Greeted us at Canopy Camp as flyover seen on 2 days.
- 37. Brown Pelican (Pelecanus occidentalis) Seen at least twice as flyovers and while landing at Panama City.
- 38. Gray-cowled Wood-Rail (Aramides cajaneus) Just split this year from Gray-necked. Seen from Harpy boats.
- 39. Southern Lapwing (Vanellus chilensis) Seen as we waited for boats on day three.
- 40. Spotted Sandpiper (Actitis macularius) Several seen along the rivers on the way to and from Nuevo Vigia.
- 41. Rock Pigeon (Columba livia) Seen near towns.
- 42. Pale-vented Pigeon (Patagioenas cayennensis) Seen on 3 days and well on the road to Yaviza.
- 43. Short-billed Pigeon (Patagioenas nigrirostris) Scoped at Nusegandi.
- 44. Ruddy Ground-Dove (Columbina talpacoti) Fairly common and seen every day.
- 45. Blue Ground-Dove (Claravis pretiosa) Flyovers on the Chucunaque.
- 46. White-tipped Dove (Leptotila verreauxi) Seen daily.
- 47. Gray-chested Dove (Leptotila cassini) heard only on day four.
- 48. Greater Ani (Crotophaga major) Abundant on day 4 river cruise
- 49. Smooth-billed Ani (Crotophaga ani) Seen daily.
- 50. Squirrel Cuckoo (Piaya cayana) Heard a lot. Seen well at Dusky-backed Jacamar spot among others.
- 51. Striped Cuckoo (Tapera naevia) Well seen at impromptu White-headed Wren stop.
- 52. Crested Owl (Lophostrix cristata) Heard only from camp.
- 53. Mottled Owl (Ciccaba virgata) Heard from Camp each night.
- 54. Common Nighthawk (Chordeiles minor). Large groups of migrant flyovers on day four at dawn.
- 55. Common Pauraque (Nyctidromus albicollis) Seen on river, on road to the camp and traveling to the boats on day 4.
- 56. White-collared Swift (Streptoprocne zonaris) Apparently uncommon in Darien but seems like we saw a few small groups on the first three days.
- 57. Band-rumped Swift (Chaetura spinicauda) Seen on several days, mostly flying high but a few times low fliers could be seen fairly well.
- 58. Short-tailed Swift (Chaetura brachyuran) A few in the big chaetura swift flocks along the Chucunaque River on day four).
- 59. Lesser Swallow-tailed Swift (Panyptila cayennensis) one or two in swift flocks seen while hawkwatching on day two.
- 60. Rufous-breasted Hermit (Glaucis hirsutus) One at San Francisco
- 61. Pale-bellied Hermit (Phaethornis anthophilus) Seen around camp feeders each day.
- 62. Stripe-throated Hermit (Phaethornis strigularis) Seen on day one near feeders.
- 63. Band-tailed Barbthroat (Threnetes ruckeri) One seen by some of the group at San Francisco.
- 64. Crowned Woodnymph (Thalurania colombica) Confusing taxonomy lumped by the AOU
- 65. Long-billed Starthroat (Heliomaster longirostris) Seen daily at feeders at Canopy Camp and at Tortí.
- 66. Scaly-breasted Hummingbird (Phaeochroa cuvierii) Seen at the feeders at Tortí both times and at

Canopy Camp.

67. White-vented Plumeleteer (Chalybura buffonii) - Seen daily at feeders at Camp.

- 68. Blue-chested Hummingbird (Amazilia amabalis) Seen on daily at feeders at Camp.
- 69. Snowy-bellied Hummingbird (Amazilia edward) Seen at feeders at Tortí on first day.
- 70. Rufous-tailed Hummingbird (Amazilia tzacatl) Seen daily.
- 71. Sapphire-throated Hummingbird (Lepidopyga coeruleogularis) Seen daily around the Camp feeders.
- 72. Violet-bellied Hummingbird (Damophila julie) Seen on at Verbena at camp just once.
- 73. Purple-crowned Fairy (Heliothryx barroti) Scoped views at the camp on day two.
- 74. Black-tailed Trogon (Trogon melanurus) Accommodating bird at the camp on day two.
- 75. White-tailed Trogon (Trogon viridis) As above
- 76. Gartered Trogon (Trogon caligatus) Quite the performance by this species at Nusegandi.
- 77. Slaty-tailed Trogon (Trogon massena) Heard day two, possibly seen on river day three.
- 78. Ringed Kingfisher (Megaceryle torquatus) Common on Rio Chucunaque
- 79. Amazon Kingfisher (Chloroceryle amazona) Rare on Chucunaque
- 80. Green Kingfisher (Chloroceryle americana) Seen in flight leaving the Harpy village.
- 81. Dusky-backed Jacamar (Brachygalba salmoni) A very range restricted bird. Seen three time on the Rio Tuquesa near Nuevo Vigia, at the spot we disembarked for them and along the Chucanaque on our way to the Harpy Eagles.
- 82. Rufous-tailed Jacamar (Galbula ruficauda) Seen well at Yaviza
- 83. Great Jacamar (Jacamerops aureus) Sweep of the Panama Jacamars with scoped views on the Harrpy Trail.
- 84. White-necked Puffbird (Notharchus macrorhynchos) Seen well perched on an open branch along the Chucunaque and at El Salto Road.
- 85. Black-breasted Puffbird (Notharchus pectoralis) Nice scoped views at San Francisco
- 86. Pied Puffbird (Notharchus tectus) Seen well on day three near jacamars.
- 87. Barred Puffbird (Nystalus radiatus) Seen well especially a pair at Yaviza.
- 88. Gray-cheeked Nunlet (Nonnula frontalis) Heard by all, seen by a couple on Harpy Trail.
- 89. White-fronted Nunbird (Monasa morphoeus) Great views along the Membrillo River.
- 90. Spot-crowned Barbet (Capito maculicoronatus) Pair on the first and last days.
- 91. Collared Aracari (Pteroglossis torquatus) Great encounters at Nusegandi
- 92. Keel-billed Toucan (Ramphastos sulfuratus) Great scope views at Nusegandi one of the first birds of the trip.
- 93. Yellow-throated Toucan (Ramphastos ambiguus) Confusing taxonomy. Was Chestnut-mandibled. One of the first birds we saw well on day one.
- 94. Olivaceous Piculet (Picumnus olivaceus) Seen at spot for Dusky-backed Jacamar (DBJA).
- 95. Black-cheeked Woodpecker (Melanerpes pucherani) Seen well at Nusegandi among other places.
- Red-crowned Woodpecker (Melanerpes rubricapillus) Almost like a taste of melanerpes home!
- 97. Red-rumped Woodpecker (Veniliornis kirkii) Seen around camp on a regular basis.
- 98. Golden-green Woodpecker (Piculus chrysochloros) Beautiful views of a female at DBJA spot
- 99. Spot-breasted Woodpecker (Colaptes punctigula) Seen well while awaiting boat on day 3.
- 100. Cinnamon Woodpecker (Celeus Ioricatus) Seen on in the Camp gardens on day 2.
- 101. Lineated Woodpecker (Dryocopus lineatus) Seen well on the first day at Nusegandi.
- 102. Crimson-crested Woodpecker (Campephilus melanoleucos) Seen on day two.
- 103. Crested Caracara (Caracara cheriway) Fly by seen on the first day of the tour.
- 104. Yellow-headed Caracara (Milvago chimachima) Meteti fields. Perched and in flight.
- 105. American Kestrel (Falco sparverius) Seen on the road on last two days.
- 106. Bat Falcon (Falco rufigularis) Perched on Canopy Property and on road to Yaviza. Memorable views.
- 107. Orange-chinned Parakeet (Brotogeris jugularis) Seen and heard every day nice views along the river on day four.
- 108. Blue-headed Parrot (Pionus menstruus) Seen every day. Mostly flyovers but a few perched along the river.

- 109. Brown-hooded Parrot (Pyrilia haematotsis) Flyovers.
- 110. Blue-fronted Parrotlet (Touit dilectissimus) Heard only at Nusegandi.
- 111. Red-lored Parrot (Amazona autumnalis) Seen daily with many hundreds on El Salto Road.
- 112. Mealy Parrot (Amazona farinosa) Mixed with Red-lored Parrots. Perched around the camp and scoped.
- 113. Spectacled Parrotlet (Forpus conspicillatus) Scoped at the gas station at the end of the world!
- 114. Chestnut-fronted Macaw (Ara severus) Three flyovers at the camp and one sighting along the river.
- 115. Double-banded Graytail (Xenerpestes minlosi) Nest at DBJA spot and a couple of sightings around camp.
- 116. Plain Xenops (Xenops minutus) Seen at Harpy trail.
- 117. Streaked Xenops (Xenops rutilans) Seen at the DBJA stop.
- 118. Cocoa Woodcreeper (Xiphorhynchus susurrans) Seen on Canopy Camp grounds among other places.
- 119. Black-striped Woodcreeper (Xiphorhynchus lachrymosus) Distinctive bird heard only on day one.
- 120. Red-billed Scythebill (Campylorhamphus trochilirostris) Heard only on Harpy Trail.
- 121. Streak-headed Woodcreeper (Lepidocolaptes souleyetii) Seen on 3 days. Best views on the camp grounds.
- 122. Great Antshrike (Taraba major) Heard on two days.
- 123. Black Antshrike (Thamnophilus nigriceps) Seen well on Harpy Trail
- 124. Black-crowned Antshrike (Thamnophilus atrinucha) Seen well on Harpy Trail (m and f).
- 125. Moustached Antwren (Myrmotherula ignota) Heard only.
- 126. White-flanked Antwren (Myrmotherula axillaris) Seen well on the Harpy trail.
- 127. Rufous-winged Antwren (Herpsilochmus rufimarginatus) heard with antbird flock on harpy Trail.
- 128. Dot-winged Antwren A pair seen well on the Harpy trail. Beautiful female.
- 129. Dusky Antbird (Cercomacra tyrannina) Seen on day two heard on day three.
- 130. Bare-crowned Antbird (Gymnocichla nudiceps) Heard by all seen by some on Harpy Trail.
- 131. White-bellied Antbird (Myrmeciza longipes) Heard only on 3 days.
- 132. Chestnut-backed Antbird (Myrmeciza exsul) Heard on two days.
- 133. Spotted Antbird (Hylophylaxnaevioides) Heard in flock on Harpy trail.
- 134. Bicolored Antbird (Gymnopithys bicolor) Heard in flock on Harpy trail.
- 135. Black-faced Antthrush (Formicarius analis) Again heard in the mix in the flock on the Harpy trail.
- 136. Sooty-headed Tyrannulet (Phyllomyias griseiceps) Seen in the trees above the dining room at the Camp.
- 137. Yellow-crowned Tyrannulet (Tyrannulus elatus) Best seen at Avicar Hotel in Torti.
- 138. Forest Elaenia (Myiopagis gaimardii) Perched in the open at DBJA spot.
- 139. Brown-capped Tyrannulet (Ornithion brunneicapillus) seen well at the camp.
- 140. Paltry (mistletoe) Tyrannulet (Zimmerius parvus) Seen days one and five.
- 141. Yellow-Green (Panamanian) Tyrannulet (Phylloscartes flavovirens) Heard but seen poorly on back side of tree on day five distinct horizontal perching.
- 142. Ochre-bellied Flycatcher (Mionectes oleaginous) Nice views near the solar panels at Canopy Camp.
- 143. Black-capped Pygmy Tyrant (Myiornis atricapillus) Heard only day one.
- 144. Southern Bentbill (Oncostoma olivaceum) Heard only on day 1 and day 4 on Harpy trail.
- 145. Common Tody-Flycatcher (Todirostrum cinereum) Seen first day and last day at hotel.
- 146. Black-headed Tody-Flycatcher (Todirostrum nigriceps) Seen and heard a couple of days around camp
- 147 Yellow-margined Flycatcher (Tolmomyias flavotectus) Seen from camp dining area.
- 148. Yellow-breasted Flycatcher (Tolmomyias flaviventris) Heard and seen somewhat regularly.

- 149. Golden-crowned Spadebill (Platyrinchus coronatus) Heard on Harpy Trail.
- 150. Brownish Twistwing (Cnipodectes subbrunneus) Heard on the Harpy trail.
- 151. Ruddy-tailed Flycatcher (Terenotriccus erythrurus) Seen on El Salto Road and around camp.
- 152. Black-tailed Flycatcher (Myiobius atricaudus) Seen on the Harpy trail.
- 153. Olive-sided Flycatcher (Contopus cooperi) Migrant seen on the two days.
- 154. Tropical Pewee (Contopus cinereus) Seen first two days and on day 4.
- 155. Eastern Wood Pewee (Contopus Virens) Non-vocal bird assumed to be this species.
- 156. Willow Flycatcher (Empidonax Traillii) Non-vocal species on Yaviza Road assumed to be this species.
- 157. Long-tailed Tyrant (Colonia colonus) Seen hawking insects on Camp grounds among other places.
- 158. Piratic Flycatcher (Legatus leucophaius) Migrants seen on 4 days.
- 159. Social Flycatcher (Myiozetetes similis) Seen on first day.
- 160. Rusty-margined Flycatcher (Myiozetetes cayanensis) Seen on all days.
- 161. Gray-capped Flycatcher (Myiozetetes granadensis) Seen on 2 days. Best at DBJA spot.
- 162. Great Kiskadee (Pitangus sulphuratus) Seen on the 2 days along roadsides.
- 163. Lesser Kiskadee (Pitangus lictor) Heard on day 3.
- 164. Streaked Flycatcher (Myiodynastes maculatus) Seen best at Torti.
- 165. Sulphur-bellied Flycatcher (Myiodynastes luteiventris) This migrant was seen on 4 days of the tour. Nice workshop on this ID from Carlos.
- 166. Boat-billed Flycatcher (Megarynchus pitangua) seen intermittently around camp and on road to Yaviza.
- 167. Tropical Kingbird (Tyrannus melancholicus) Abundant species, seen daily.
- 168. Fork-tailed Flycatcher (Tyrannus savanna) Seen on last day on road near airport.
- 169. Eastern Kingbird (Tyrannus tyrannus) Seen three days including one large flock of migrants feeding on hatchout along the river's edge.
- 170. Choco Sirystes (Sirystes sibilator) Small illusive group at San Francisco.
- 171. Dusky-capped Flycatcher (Myiarchus tuberculifer) Best at San Francisco Reserve perched in open.
- 172. Northern Scrub Flycatcher (Sublegatus arenarum) At DBJA spot.
- 173. Bright-rumped Attila (Attila spadiceus) Scoped views of bright-rump at El Salto
- 174. Blue Cotinga (Cotinga nattererii) Beautiful scoped views of male at DBJA spot.
- 175. Purple-throated Fruitcrow (Querula purpurata) Poor flyover views on river day 4.
- 176. Golden-collared Manakin (Manacus vitellinus) Seen on two days. Two males and a female.
- 177. Red-capped Manakin (Dixiphia mentalis) Seen on the first and last day.
- 178. Black-crowned Tityra (Tityra inquisitor) Seen on four days.
- 179. Masked Tityra (Tityra semifasciata) Seen on three days.
- 180. Cinnamon Becard (Pachyramphus cinnamomeus) Common. Seen on all days.
- 181. White-winged Becard (Pachyramphus polychopterus) Seen on two days. Best at Canopy Camp.
- 182. Yellow-green Vireo (Vireo flavoviridis) Migrant attracted to boa mob!
- 183. Red-eyed Vireo (Vireo Olivaceous) A migrant seen on the two days.
- 184. Black-chested Jay (Cyanocorax affinis) Seen from one boat on day three.
- 185. Gray-breasted Martin (Progne chalybea) Seen daily, including huge numbers roosting near Harpy village.
- 186. Mangrove Swallow (Tachycineta albilinea) Seen well on both river trips.
- 187. Southern Rough-winged Swallow (Stelgidopteryx ruficollis) lots of migrants passing over most numerous on first day at Nusegandi.
- 188. Barn Swallow (Hirundo rustica) A few birds seen on 4 days of the trip.
- 189. Cliff Swallow (Petrochelidon pyrrhonata) A few birds on two days. First seen on the river on the way back from DBJA.
- 190. Black-capped Donacobius (Donacobius atricapillus) Brief flyby near Harpy village.

- 191. White-headed Wren (Campylorhynchus albobrunneus) Best views of a drive by flyby that we then tracked down at the local church.
- 192. Black-bellied Wren (Thryothorus fasciatoventris) Killer views at Torti
- 193. Buff-breasted Wren (Cantorchilus leucotis) Best views in camp on the last day while awaiting the barbets.
- 194. Bay Wren (Cantorchilus nigricapillus) Heard tantalizingly close at San Francisco Reserve.
- 195. Stripe-throated Wren (Cantorchilus leucopogon) Heard only on Harpy trail.
- 196. House Wren (Troglodytes aedon) Common around camp and other structures during trip.
- 197. White-breasted Woodwren (Henicorhina leucosticte) Singing at DBJA spot.
- 198. Song Wren (Cyphorhinus phaeocephalus) Uncoopeerative bird on Harpy trail heard only.
- 199. Long-billed Gnatwren (Ramphocaenus melanurus) Heard only on Day 1.
- 200. Tropical Gnatcatcher (Polioptila plumbea) High in the tallest trees at El Salto Road.
- 201. Tropical Mockingbird (Mimus gilvus) Several seen on the first day around Torti.
- 202. Clay-colored Thrush (Turdus Grayi) Common at pre-tour hotel. One on tour at Torti.
- 203. Yellow-crowned Euphonia (Euphonia luteicapilla) Seen on 3 days around camp. Good views mobbing boa.
- 204. Thick-billed Euphonia (Euphonia laniirostris) Seen on 4 days. Good views mobbing boa.
- 205. Cerulean Warbler (Setophaga cerulean) Seen a few times in mixed flocks. First mobbing boa.
- 206. Yellow Warbler (Setophaga petechia) A few seen on 4 days.
- 207. Buff-rumped Warbler (Myiothlypis fulvicauda) Heard at San Francisco, but would not show.
- 208. Red-breasted Blackbird (Sturnella militaris) Seen well in fields near Meteti on last day.
- 209. Yellow-rumped Cacique (Cacicus cela) Seen on 3 days. Best on the road to Yaviza.
- 210. Chestnut-headed Oropendola (Psarocolius wagleri) Seen 3 days. On road to Yaviza and on river rides
- 211. Crested Oropendola (Psarocolius decumanus) Seen on 3 days. On Road to Yaviza was best.
- 212. Black Oropendola (Psarocolius guatimozinus) Seen on three days. Flybys at Yaviza and on boats.
- 213. Yellow-backed Oriole (Icterus chrysater) On river day four.
- 214. Orchard Oriole (Icterus spurius) Seen while watching the fields at Meteti
- 215. Orange-crowned Oriole (Icterus auricapillus) Seen on 3 days. Best at DBJA spot.
- 216. Great-tailed Grackle (Quiscalus mexicanus) Seen on along the Pan-American Highway and in towns like Yaviza.
- 217. Shiny Cowbird (Molothrus bonariensis) Seen on Day 3.
- 218. Giant Cowbird (Molothrus oryzivorus) Flyby seen on 2 days.
- 219. Bananaquit (Coereba flaveola) Seen daily, even eating banana.
- 220. White-shouldered Tanager (Tachyphonus luctuosus) Seen well at San Francisco and also on El Salto
- 221. Crimson-backed Tanager (Ramphocelus dimidiatus) Beautiful bird seen daily.
- 222. Blue-gray Tanager (Thraupis episcopus) Seen daily.
- 223. Palm Tanager (Thraupis palmarum) Seen daily.
- 224. Plain-colored Tanager (Tangara inornata) Seen daily.
- 225. White-eared Conebill (Conirostrum leucogenys) Seen on day 2 & 3.
- 226. Golden-hooded Tanager (Tangara larvata) Active nest discovered in camp gardens.
- 227. Dusky-headed Tanager (Mitrospingus cassinii) Seen by some of group at the San Francisco preserve.
- 228. Carmiol's Tanager (Chlorothraupis carmioli) Heard only. Skulky bird on day one would not show himself.
- 229. Flame-rumped Tanager (Ramphocelus flammigerus_ Male and female seen along the river on two days.
- 230. Blue Dacnis (Dacnis cayana) Seen on all days.
- 231. Shining Honeycreeper (Cyanerpes lucidus) Brief views for some at San Francisco
- 232. White-eared Conebill (Conirostrum leucogenys). Heard but only brief distant views on two days.

- 233. Blue-black Grassquit (Volatinia jacarina) Performing male was most memorable.
- 234. Variable Seedeater (Sporophila americana corvina) Seen on 4 days in various grassy habitats.
- 235. Yellow-bellied Seedeater (Sporophila minuta) Scoped on the first day at Torti.
- 236. Thick-billed Seed-Finch (Oryzoborus funereus) Seen on 2 days of the trip. Female at Yaviza showed well.
- 237. Buff-throated Saltator (Saltator Maximus) Nice perched views at DBJA spot.
- 238. Blue-black Grosbeak (Cyanocompsa cyanoides) Heard first and last days. Did not want to be viewed either time.
- 239. Great Potoo (Nyctibius grandis) Perched along the river Chucanaque on day three and in flight at dusk on day four.
- 240. House Sparrow (Passer domesticus) Seen in towns while traveling.



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
